Continued PUBLIC HEARING relative to application for a Special Permit pursuant to Section 17-10.15, REGISTERED MARIJUANA DISPENSARY USES of the Revised Zoning Ordinances from Major Bloom, LLC, 50 Loring Street, Hyde Park, MA, to operate a Marijuana Business for property located at 20 John Williams Street, Attleboro, MA. said premises being Assessor's Plat #33, Lot's #221A, 221C, 221D and 222, located in an Industrial Zoning District and having an area of 3.62 + acres.

Continued PUBLIC HEARING relative to the school property located at 135 County Street and the associated parking lot at 0 Cora Street that are no longer needed for school purposes and may be transferred to the City. In accordance with Section 2-11.2 of the City Ordinances, the City will declare that the Old High School, 135 County Street, and the parking lot at 0 Cora Street will be available for disposition. The Old High School and 0 Cora Street are currently assessed at \$6,303,900.00 and \$125,600.00 respectively.
